PM visits Manipur today, 1st since unrest broke out

Imphal, 12 September

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Manipur on September 13 and interact with internally displaced people in Churachandpur and Imphal, Chief Secretary Puneet Kumar Goel said on Friday, in the first official confirmation of the PM's trip to the strife-torn state.

This will be Modi's first visit to Manipur since ethnic violence broke out in the state two years ago.

The Prime Minister will also unveil development projects worth ₹8,500 crore, Goel said at a press conference here.

In a release, the Prime Minister's Office said, "In line with his commitment to inclusive, sustainable and holistic development of Manipur, the PM will lay the foundation stone of multiple development projects worth over ₹7,300 crore at Churachandpur." Modi will also inaugurate multiple development projects worth more than ₹1,200 crore at Imphal, it said.

Addressing the press conference, the chief secretary asserted that peace is "not only the absence of violence but also the presence of trust, harmony and reconciliation."

"Thus, the visit of the Prime Minister to Manipur will pave the way to peace, normalcy and accelerated growth in the state. Honble PM will be arriving in Manipur on September 13 from Aizawl," he said.

Modi will interact with internally displaced people in Churachandpur and Imphal, and address two rallies during his visit to the state, he said.

"On his arrival in Churachandpur around 12:15 pm, he will first interact with some IDPs (internally displaced persons) in the district. He will lay the foundation stones for various infrastructure projects to be taken up throughout the state. The PM will address a public gathering at Peace Ground in Churachandpur.

"Thereafter, he will arrive at Kangla around 2:30 pm and first interact with

Projects worth ₹72K cr to be inaugurated across states

New Delhi, 12 September

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Mizoram, Manipur, Assam, West Bengal and Bihar between 13 September and 15 September inaugurating infrastructure and energy projects worth over ₹71,850 crore.

He will inaugurate ₹9,000 crore projects in Aizawl on Saturday, including a line that establishes the first rail connection between Mizoram's capital and the rest of the rail network. This includes ₹8070 crore Bairabi-Sarang rail line which has 45 tunnels constructed under complex geological conditions and also includes 55 major bridges and 88 minor bridges.

With direct connectivity established, Modi will flag off three new express trains, Sairang (Aizawl)-Delhi (Anand Vihar Terminal) Rajdhani Express, Sairang-Guwahati Express and Sairang-Kolkata Express. He will also lay the foundation stone of multiple road projects — Aizawl Bypass Road (Ra 500 crore), Thenzawl-Sialsuk Road and Khankawn-Rongura Road.

The PM will lay the foundation stone of the Chhimtuipui River Bridge on the Lawngtlai-Siaha Road, which is an important part of enhancing cross border trade via the Kaladan Multimodal Transit Framework. The enhanced connectivity will improve access to hospitals, universities, and markets, the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) said.

In Manipur, foundation stones for projects worth ₹7,300 crore will be laid, including Manipur Urban Roads, drainage and an asset management improvement project worth over ₹3,600 crore;

Dynasts rule the roost in LS

Over a fifth of sitting legislators have dynastic backgrounds; Congress share highest at 32%

Nearly 21 per cent (1,107) of the 5,204 sitting Members of Parliament (MPs), Members of Legislative Assemblies (MLAs) and Members of Legislative Councils (MLCs), have dynastic backgrounds, according to an analysis by the Association of Democratic Reforms (ADR) released on Friday.

Their representation is highest in the Lok Sabha at 31 per cent, and lowest in Assemblies at 20 per cent. The Rajya Sabha and state Legislative Councils report 21 per cent and 22 per cent dynastic representation, respectively.

The ADR report said that among the national parties, 3,214 sitting MPs, MLAs and MLCs have been analysed and 657 (20 per cent) have dynastic backgrounds.

The Congress has the highest share at 32 per cent, followed by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) at 18 per cent. The CPI (M) has the lowest, with just 8 per cent of its members from political families. Among state parties, of the 1,809 MPs, MLAs and MLCs analysed, 406 (22 per cent) have dynastic backgrounds.

Among the states, Uttar Pradesh ranks highest in absolute numbers with 141 (23 per cent) out of 604 MPs, MLAs and MLCs analysed having dynastic political backgrounds. Maharashtra follows with 129 (32 per cent) out of 403 sitting legislators from dynastic backgrounds.



In terms of proportion in larger states, Andhra Pradesh has the highest share of dynastic representation, with 86 (34 per cent) out of 255 sitting MPs, MLAs and MLCs coming from political families. This is followed by Maharashtra, where 129 (32 per cent) out of 403 MPs, MLAs and MLCs have dynastic background and Karnataka, 94 (29 per cent) out of 326 MPs, MLAs and MLCs having dynastic backgrounds.

The report said that out of 4,665 sitting male MPs, MLAs and MLCs analysed, 856 (18 per cent) have dynastic backgrounds. Among 539 sitting female MPs, MLAs and MLCs, 251 (47 per cent) are from political families.

Govt plans \$3.4 bn rail lines near China border

India is set to reinforce its northeastern frontier by adding railway infrastructure to deepen access, accelerate logistics and ensure military readiness in case warming ties with neighbouring China falter again.

The approved plan involves laying 500 kilometres (about 310 miles) of rail lines, including bridges and tunnels, to connect remote regions bordering China, Bangladesh, Myanmar and Bhutan, according to people familiar with the matter.

The project, which will likely cost the government 300 billion rupees (\$3.4 billion), is expected to be completed within four years, said the people, who asked not to be identified as the information is not public.

Though ties with China have recently shown signs of warming, India's infrastructure strategy reflects long-term contingency planning that's mindful of a decades-old relationship marked by cycles of rapprochement and strain. Five years after a border clash, the neighbours have recently been mending fences, drawn together by economic opportunity and shifting trade dynamics under US President Donald Trump.

India's new rail corridors will complement extensive road infrastructure built over the past decade. The country has added 9,984 kilometres of highways at a cost of 1.07 trillion rupees, with another 5,055 kilometres under construction.

The logistics upgrade is expected to improve civilian access and reduce response times during emergencies, including natural disasters or military mobilisations.

OBITUARY | JAGDEEP S CHHOKAR (Nov 25, 1944-Sep 12, 2025)

Voice behind the battle against ills that plagued India's electoral system

Last year, when asked during a discussion whether simultaneous polls would make elections more cost-efficient, Jagdeep S Chhokar, the cofounder of poll rights body Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR), said he found it painful when people put a monetary value on democracy. "If we want the cheapest possible elections that (would) mean we want the cheapest possible democracy," Chhokar said.

Never known to mince his words, always willing to help — even when he was on vacation or convalescing — those he thought could add to his voice to battle the ills that plague India's electoral systems and to bring greater transparency and accountability in Indian politics, Chhokar passed away in Delhi on Friday after suffering a heart attack. He was 80. "Prof Jagdeep Chhokar's vision reshaped the way India thinks about elections and accountability. His absence leaves a void, but his example will continue to inspire all who strive for a stronger and more vibrant democracy," ADR said.

Chhokar had had an illustrious academic career before his colleagues, including Trilochan Sastry, and he founded the ADR in 1999. Born on November 25, 1944, Chhokar earned degrees in engineering in 1967, pursued an MBA from Delhi University's Faculty of Management Studies (1977), and later earned a PhD from the Louisiana State University in the US. He joined IIM-



Ahmedabad in 1985, teaching in the field of organisational behaviour until his retirement in 2006. Chhokar also served as the dean and director-in-charge during his tenure at IIM-Ahmedabad. He had also worked with the Indian Railways for over a decade, and as an international marketing manager with a public sector organisation for four years. Apart from IIM-A, Chhokar had taught at universities in Australia, France, Japan, and the US. In later years, Chhokar earned a law degree in 2005 from Gujarat University — something that helped him with the ADR legal work. He was a keen bird-watcher, obtaining a certificate in ornithology from the Bombay Natural History Society in 2001, and enjoyed the company of birds on the IIM-A campus and wherever he travelled, states his profile on the IIM-A website.

Over the past two decades, the ADR spearheaded several landmark judicial interventions. These included the 2002

Supreme Court judgment making it mandatory for candidates to disclose their criminal cases, assets, and educational qualifications, and its most recent was to challenge the Election Commission's Special Intensive Survey (SIR) in Bihar. The ADR's other recent notable intervention was challenging the Electoral Bonds scheme, which the Supreme Court struck down in 2024.

In 1999, Chhokar along with his IIM colleague Sastry petitioned the Delhi High Court, where they demanded candidates in elections to the Lok Sabha and state assemblies disclose criminal cases pending against them in their nomination papers. In its verdict next year, the court said it should be mandatory for candidates to disclose criminal cases pending against them, which the Supreme Court upheld in 2002. The Centre amended the Representation of the People Act, 1950, to get around the apex court's order, which the SC struck down in 2003. Looking back, Chhokar told a newspaper two decades later, the government's effort to stonewall the reform turned him into a "diehard activist".

Over the course of the next 20 years, Chhokar brought his brilliance, scholarship, and diligence to the legal and advocacy work that the ADR pursued, such as filing petitions, producing reports, and building public tools like the MyNeta database.

Chhokar's body has been donated to Delhi's Lady Hardinge Medical College for medical research.
